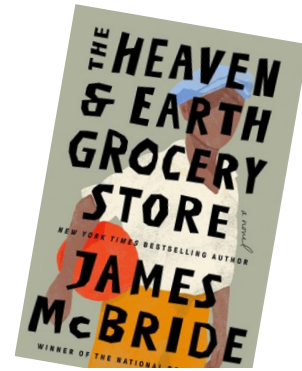

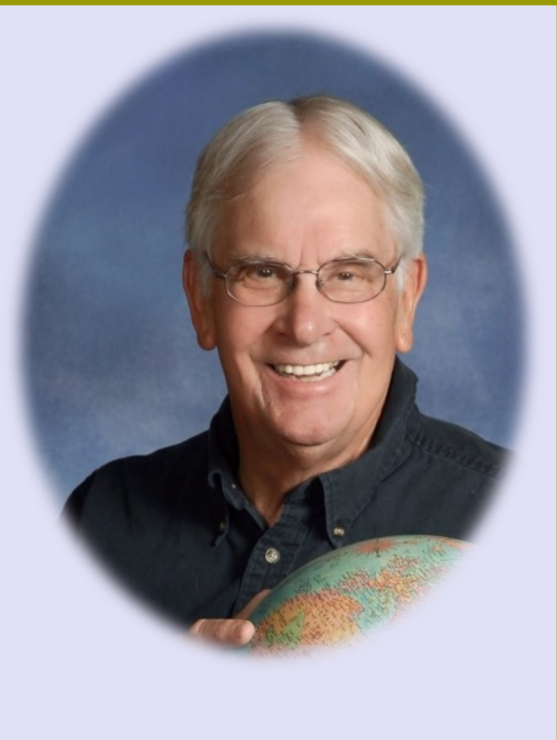

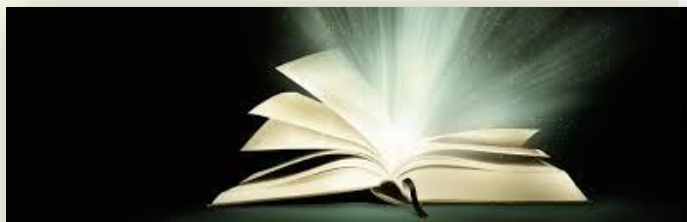

Team Presbyterian is Forming Again!
Redlands Hunger Walk
Save the Date - June 1, 2024, at 8:00 A.M.

The Family Service Association of Redlands (FSAR) 10th Annual Hunger Walk is scheduled for June 1, 2024. This walk is designed to help alleviate food insecurity in our community and bring awareness to this critical issue. With increasing food costs, the low-income clients FSAR serves are vulnerable to food insecurity and hunger. This 5k walk seeks to raise funds to alleviate this insecurity.

The 5K walk is a family friendly event. The walk begins and ends at the University of Redlands Memorial Chapel. **Pre-registration deadline for Team Presbyterian is Mother's Day, Sunday, May 12, 2024**, as the deadline for team registration occurs on May 17, 2024. So, check your calendars and plan to participate as we step up to stop hunger in our community. All proceeds benefit the FSAR's food pantry and breakfast program. Last year, FSAR provided over 1,200 client families with emergency food assistance, 900 families in our community with food boxes, and more than 5,000 individuals with hot meals at their breakfast program during the last quarter of the year.

On April 14, Pastor Cheryl will make her way to Serra Retreat Center in Malibu for Companions on the Inner Way, a contemplative retreat. The theme this year is "Canticle of Creation: Mirror of God." To Saint Francis, Mother Earth was a mirror of God. We all know Pastor Cheryl's soul is fed by the natural world as well. The retreat will focus on the legacy of Celtic Christianity, for it reminds us that the teachings of the Bible are the wee book, set beside the big book that is Creation. The retreat leaders write, "Unfortunately, much of our contemporary spiritual and religious practice, has lost its connection with the earth, the living water, the voice of God in all her creatures." Pastor Cheryl and Elder Ann Laudermilk from Magnolia Presbyterian Church will be the Presbytery of Riverside's representatives at Board of Pensions training, paid for by the Board of Pensions.

Contemplative Corner

Praying with the Gospel of Mark

Do you have a favorite resurrection story? One that certainly doesn't rank near the top of anyone's list is Mark's version. This closing statement of Mark's short ending is, "And [the women] said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid." There is no appearance of the risen Christ, only a young man dressed in white telling the women to not be alarmed. But then they are seized with fear, so they keep quiet. I simply ask who wouldn't have been terrified?

Of course, this is why I appreciate that we have four different accounts of this day that changed history forever. Not unlike all of us sharing about a memorable event we experienced. We would all have a different take on what happened. We would all be seeing the event through our own lens, seasoned by our life experiences. So, I invite you to pray with our resurrection story from Mark, even though it is most likely not your favorite and may even make you uncomfortable.

"When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint [Jesus]. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, 'Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?' When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back." [Mark 16:1-4]

What details caught your attention in these first four verses? Did you notice the word "up" in this text as in "look up?" How many times do we forget to look up, often missing so much. I know I can get so focused at home that I forget to look up and look out my office window. But when I do, the marvelous mountains are in view. When I take the time to look up, Psalm 121 speaks to my soul, "I lift up my eyes to the hills – from where does my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth." As you walk through this month with this passage, remember to look up for God might very well be communicating with you.

They were ready to ritually wash Jesus’ body with spices. Their story felt like it was ending. Their eyes were downcast, but then they finally looked up and discovered to their amazement that the large stone had been rolled away. Upon looking up they also encounter a young man dressed in a white robe who said, “Do not be afraid... Jesus has been raised [and] he is going ahead of you to Galilee.”



We need to “Look up” and “Listen up” to see God at work around us. I wonder what you are seeing. I wonder what you are hearing. Let’s share what we are seeing and hearing with each other, so that as a church we can respond to what God is already doing in our community. Jesus went ahead to Galilee, and I suggest that Jesus does the same today. God is already at work, just wondering if we are going to notice. Let’s be in partnership with God and be up to something good now and always!

PROPERTY AND FINANCE UPDATE



Property

The property and finance committee continues to work diligently with our various facility users to maximize the use of our space and generate the income needed to maintain our wonderful facility. We enjoyed the Redlands Symphony Recitals held on our campus and appreciate the contributions from events like this to help our church continue its ministry.

The hard and consistent rains of the last season demonstrated several issues with our campus. One of these issues was the leaking of ground water through the brick wall of the John Knox Hall basement area. During the storms, the water flooded about 1/3 of the basement floor area. Since the basement is not yet complete and not yet in use by our Scout Troops, there was minimal damage at this time. In an effort to mitigate future damage to the basement and John Knox Hall foundation, the session approved the removal of the dirt “planter” area between the parking lot and the John Knox hall building. This area will be cemented in and appropriate drains will be installed to direct the water away from the basement walls and foundation. The cost for this will come from special funds and not from the general budget.

Overall, our total YTD income of \$63,927.91 exceeded our total YTD expenses of \$45,337.09 by \$18,590. Our actual donations and pledges are more than what was anticipated by this point in the year by \$4,590.78. Some of our pledges are quarterly or annually, which contributes some to this difference. Our insurance payment, which is over \$6,000 each quarter will be paid in March. Several other payments will be made in March, which will affect the income shown so far this year. The Adjusted NUI happens below the Net Unrestricted Income (NUI) line because the principal payment of our loan reduces liability, so it is not considered an expense for accounting purposes.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS MARCH 2024



The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Redlands held its regularly scheduled Stated Session Meeting on Monday evening, March 18, 2024, via a Zoom Meeting, and took the following actions:

- Received the Unaudited Financial Report for the month ending February 29, 2024.

Total Unrestricted Income:	\$32,020.97
Total Unrestricted Expense:	\$22,932.23
Unrestricted Income (Loss):	\$9,088.74
Less Principal Payment on Loan:	(\$669.46)
Adjusted Unrestricted Income:	\$8,419.28
Balance in General Account:	\$121,535.12
Total Operating Funds in General Account:	\$42,130.06

- Unanimously approved the Personnel Committee recommendation to classify the three Chancel Choir Section Leaders as employees of FPCR (per the requirement from the recent revision of the U.S. Department of Labor Fair Labor Standards Act), with specifications that 1) the rate of pay for each Section Leader be \$18/per hour (a total of 2.5 hours each Sunday) in order to cover the additional tax which will affect the employee; 2) each Section Leader will be expected to go through the California Live Scan program; and 3) each Section Leader must participate in the required online training programs.
- Unanimously approved the revised Facilities Use Policy and Procedures, as recommended by the Property & Finance Committee.
- Unanimously approved the Rental Rates for members and non-members for 2024.
- Unanimously approved the revised Depository and Withdrawal Procedures, as recommended by the Property & Finance Committee.
- Unanimously approved a proposal to remove the planter area between the parking lot and John Knox Hall, reworking and adding drains in that area in order to eliminate the flooding in the John Knox Hall basement during rainstorms, at a cost not to exceed \$6,500.
