The Pastor's Corner "Be Here Now"

I think Andy Williams was the first to sing this catchy Christmas tune, "It's the most wonderful time of the year." The first verse goes like this, "It's the most wonderful time of the year, with the kids jingle belling and everyone telling you to be of good cheer. It's the most wonderful time of the year." And the next phrase builds our expectations of this season saying, "It's the hap-happiest season of all."

Yet, we all know that Advent and Christmas seasons are fraught with many emotions and memories. Often many memories are "hap-happiest," but certainly not all. Sometimes this season is difficult to navigate, especially if a significant loss is still raw or another life circumstance has unexpectedly interrupted one's life.

So, what if we modified our expectations of this season. What if we didn't build up the expectation that this would the "hap-happiest" time of year. What if we simply focused on the art of being fully present with each other and see where it takes us. What if we stopped worrying about buying the perfect present and started practicing being present to those we encounter along the road of life, whether at a grocery store or at home. What if this season, our presence with each other was the present?

I know the surgeon general of the United States, Dr. Vivek H Muthry, would support this focus. He learned on a listening tour across America that many people feel isolated, invisible, and insignificant and his tour was even before the pandemic. Since the pandemic social disconnection has escalated and even been declared an epidemic. This disconnection or loneliness is far more than a bad feeling for it harms both individual and societal health and puts individuals at greater risks for all sorts of medical issues. So being present with each other can be life giving and this shouldn't



Praying the Gospel of Matthew

Although we move to the Gospel of Mark in Advent, I want to circle back and invite you to reread the first two chapters of Matthew as we close out this year with praying through Matthew. What part of the birth story of Jesus resonates with you this Advent given where you find yourself?

- Does the genealogy of Jesus call to mind ancestors of your own?
- Does Joseph's dream call forth something that God is drawing your attention to?
- What about the wise ones speaks of your faith journey, for when have you listened to God and changed your direction?
- How does the need for Joseph, Mary, and baby Jesus to flee their home speak into our world today? How does this help you see the humanity of those who flee for their very lives?
- What caution does the power of Herod to destroy life have for us today? How should we choose those who lead us?
- As the holy family returns home, how does it help you understand what home means for you?

Read and reread these two chapters, praying for the Spirit to speak into your life this Advent season. We worship a living God, one who is actively transforming our lives from one degree of glory to another.

come as a surprise given the reason for this season.

As Isaiah cried out to God, "O that you would tear open the heavens and come down." And God did— in baby Jesus. I appreciate the way Eugene Peterson describes this incarnation of God in Jesus, he writes, "The Word became flesh and



blood, and moved into the neighborhood." Jesus's physical presence was the present. Emmanuel - God with us! And I believe it is this "withness" that we are called to live out in our daily lives with each other. A "withness" that helps dispel the feelings of isolation, invisibility, and insignificance for each other.

When we feel seen and heard something within us soars. When others take the time to call or visit, to send a note or drop by some flowers by we know that we are not alone. Often words are not even necessary for a simple smile can brighten someone's day.

As we move through this season of Advent and Christmas, I want to challenge all of us to be fully present with others. A presence that is genuinely present and not distracted by a todo list. I know you have heard this saying before, but this season let us all try to live it: "Yesterday is history, tomorrow is a mystery, today is a gift of God which is why we call it the present." The present moment is the only moment we have, yet we often let our yesterdays or tomorrows rob us of the present.

Back in my corporate days, I was part of a facilitator team that led a four-day training seminar. I remember one group that was particularly annoyed that they had to participate — a bunch of corporate lawyers. Well, one by one at the end of the seminar they came to thank me for the segment I facilitated titled, "BE HERE NOW." Their "AHA" was that they never were present to the moment, whether at work or at home and this hit deeply for their home lives. They realized being present in the now was a gift.

Let us remember why we celebrate this season for The Word moved into our neighborhood. May we all be flesh and blood, fully present with each other in the now. Be the gift of presence to others this holy season.

PROPERTY AND FINANCE UPDATE



2024 Pledges

On Sunday, October 26th we began to receive pledges for 2024. Thank you to everyone who has already submitted a pledge. If you have not had the opportunity to submit a pledge, cards are available in the sanctuary narthex or the office. Our collective pledges will help the Session finalize our 2024 Ministry Budget. Our collective generosity makes our ministry possible.

Finances and Property Usage

Here are some broad highlights from our financial reporting Year to Date November 30, 2023:

So, what do these numbers mean? Our donations and pledges are less than what was anticipated at this point in the year by \$15,672. Our Net Unrestricted Income (NUI) was more than our expenses by \$6,542. The Adjusted NUI happens below the NUI line because the principal payments on our loan of \$6,565.77 YTD are not considered an expense for accounting purposes, although the principal payment does come out of our checking account. Therefore, at the end of October our Adjusted NUI was less than our expenses by \$23.34, that is, we have spent slightly more than we have received so far this year.

As the year draws to a close, to finish the year financially strong we will need our collective generosity to address the deficit, which may grow because of a large insurance payment that occurs in December. Yearend financial gifts need to be in the office or postmarked before the end of the year. We trust that God's provision will be enough for us as we rely on God's abundance. Our collective generosity and our community partnerships, along with the movement of the Spirit among us, make our ministries possible. Thanks be to God for our ministries.

If you ever have any questions or concerns about finance or facility issues, please ask James Rager, our Property and Finance Moderator, or Pastor Cheryl.
