## The Pastor's Corner My Prayer



## *Contemplative Corner*

### *Praying with the Gospel of Mark*

During the upcoming sabbatical season, spend some time with the parables. Parables use common elements to convey deep meanings. Parables can be found mostly in Matthew, Mark, and Luke, the synoptics gospels. I have chosen one found in Matthew 13:31-32, Luke 13:18 and Mark 4:30-32. Here is Mark's version:

“Jesus also said, ‘With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade.’” [Mark 4:30-32]

What small thing have you done that has grown in its ability to benefit others? The kingdom of heaven is at hand in small things that are done with great love, when small acts of kindness ripple throughout a community, when small offerings are multiplied to create impact. As Mother Teresa of Calcutta reminds us, "Be faithful in small things because it is in them that your strength lies." What small thing might grow in and through you this summer to bless others?

### NEXT STATED MEETING OF THE PRESBYTERY OF RIVERSIDE SATURDAY, JUNE 15, 2024

When asked, "Who is the Presbytery," the simple answer is we are! We are a part of a greater whole known as the Presbytery of Riverside, which encompasses all Riverside County, San Bernardino County and even part of Kern County! The Presbytery of Riverside currently has 25 churches.

On June 15, 2024, at 10:00 A.M. clergy and elder commissioners of these 25 churches along with Presbytery staff and committee leadership will meet to worship and make decisions together at Little Church of the Desert located in Twentynine Palms. This meeting will be in-person only. The Presbytery Assembly is organized to have 50% clergy and 50% elders as its voting members, which are called commissioners. Of course, it will depend on who attends each meeting!

The Presbytery Assembly is an open meeting, which means observers are welcome to experience a Presbytery meeting firsthand by simply registering at least five days before the meeting and then physically attending on the day of the meeting. 
### Financial Update as of April 30, 2024

So, what do these numbers mean? Our donations and pledges YTD are more than anticipated by \$561.55. As we head into the summer months and travel begins, let's remember to continue to be generous with our giving. Our YTD Net Unrestricted Income (NUI) is \$12,314.76. This strong position will prepare us for our next large quarterly insurance payment. The Adjusted NUI happens below the NUI line because the principal on our loan is not considered an expense for accounting purposes, although the principal payment does come out of our checking account. Therefore, at the end of April our income was \$9,633.57 more than our total expenses. Our continued generosity is necessary to help us to be financially strong as the year progresses.

## INTRODUCING PASTOR RUBENS MUZIO

My name is Rubens Muzio, I'm Brazilian, I live in Londrina, and I'd like to share a little bit about my life, because I'll be with you soon.

I grew up in a Presbyterian family in the countryside of Brazil and decided to study theology at the age of 17. I immersed myself in the waters of theology in Campinas, a journey that led me to deepen my knowledge in the USA, with a master's degree at Calvin Seminary and a doctorate from Westminster Seminary in pastoral theology, and then in Scotland, at the prestigious University of Aberdeen, where I explored theology more systematically.


But it wasn't in the academic rigor in the halls of renowned institutions that I experienced the true spiritual energy that highlights my journey. It happened in the tapestry of daily life, as a pastor of local churches in Brazil and Canada, training church planters for less evangelized regions, in friendship and mentoring of leaders, and in missionary work. As a SEPAL missionary, I have taken this spiritual and practical theology beyond the academic walls, integrating it into the lives of people of faith and religious organizations. And as the coordinator of the Doctor of Ministry at FTSA, my goal is to guide and learn along with those who, like me, are on an ongoing journey of discovery and spiritual growth. In addition, I have found the constant Presence of the Eternal in the arts, music, yoga, hiking, biking, and breaking bread with friends.

As a pastor, theologian, and writer, therefore, I

have sought to integrate theory with practice, theology with spirituality; searching in the pages of library books, in the struggles and pains of life, in the stillness and contemplation of nature and in the connection with friends, a vocation that still reverberates through my videos, texts, courses, mentoring and classrooms. On a path woven between faith and understanding, my journey has been a constant search for depth of reflection, individuation, meaning in life, and bliss of soul.

I'm so excited to meet you and spend this summer together!
